**RBI approves appointment of Chaturvedi as ICICI non-exec chairman**

New Delhi, July 18 (PTT):

ICICI Bank has said RBI has approved the appointment of Girish Chandra Chaturvedi as non-executive (part time) Chairman of the bank till 30 June, 2021.

The private lender had appointed the former petroleum secretary as the company's non-executive chairman on 29 June.

'We wish to inform you that RBI...has approved the appointment of Girish Chandra Chaturvedi as Non-executive (part time) Chairman of the bank effective today till 30 June, 2021,' ICICI Bank said in a regulatory filing.

ICICI Bank is under the scanner of various regulatory agencies for alleged conflict of interest involving its CEO Chanda Kochhar and her family members in extending loans to some corporates, including the Videocon Group.

Last month, ICICI Bank announced that Kochhar has decided to go on leave till the completion of an external enquiry into the matter.

**Task force to examine feasibility of \$1 bn fund in Lat America**

New Delhi, July 18 (PTT):

The Global Steering Group for Impact Investment today announced the launch of a task force to determine the feasibility of \$1 billion fund to drive social and environmental impact in 20 countries across Central and South America.

Once viability has been established, the Latin America Impact Fund of Funds (LIFF) Task Force intends to launch the fund of funds to strengthen the intermediary market.

Latin American countries have made significant progress on key social and environmental fronts over the last decade, but significant challenges remain.

According to estimates, about 40 per cent of their population live in vulnerable conditions: 115 million people live in informal urban settlements, more than 80 million people are affected by insufficient water supply and sanitation, twenty per cent of the regional population lacks access to basic health-care facilities, and nearly ten per cent of young people have not completed primary school.

The fund will seek to address these issues by providing patient debt and equity capital to social and environmental impact funds in Latin America.

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**Infra hurdles hurting adoption of e-medical records: IT Min**

**◆ Report prepared by the Ministry reveals govt hospitals & dispensaries have few ICT facilities**

Chennai, July 18:

The government is facing serious challenges in its efforts to adopt an electronic health records (EHR) system as a sweeping digital database of every Indian's medical record that can be accessed by doctors and hospitals is aimed at transforming healthcare in the country.

These challenges range from infrastructure creation, policy and regulations, standards and interoperability to research and development.

A latest review report prepared by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) titled 'Adoption of Electronic Health Records: A Roadmap for India' has

revealed how the country lacks the basic requirements to implement the system.

Government officials reviewed documents and reports from various concerned government agencies, such as the MeitY, the Health Ministry and NITI Aayog as well as reports from other countries such as Canada, Germany and the US where such a digital health records of citizens are in place.

Reports published by organizations such as the Healthcare Information and Management Sys-

In view of the size of the country, there is a need to take a Free and Open Source Software (FOSS) approach to make good quality software available to hospitals and individual practitioners. In FOSS, the software code is made freely accessible and can be modified by anyone. If it is in the FOSS domain, even local entrepreneurs can provide technical support. Currently, the Hospital Information System (HIS) software is used in India.

tems Society (HIMSS), an America non-profit dedicated to improving healthcare through the use of information technology and management systems, were also included.

India has a mixed system of healthcare consisting of a large number of hospitals run by the Central and State governments

as well as the private sector. The report found that, in general, the level of use of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) in healthcare in India is lower than in other countries.

When it comes to basic infrastructure, the report highlighted that government hospitals and dispensaries have very little ICT infrastructure. Only some major public hospitals, such as the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) and the Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and

Research (PGIMER), have computers and connectivity. 'The number of public healthcare facilities is quite large in the country; therefore, a large investment in hardware and software is required. To reduce expenses, it is necessary to use open source software systems, mobile devices, and the cloud computing environment,' Senior Director at the Department of Electronics and Information Technology, Sunil Kumar Srivastava, said. 'However the government is working towards adoption of ICT



60 per cent of inpatients in India being treated in private healthcare facilities, the report said it is necessary for the government to bring these establishments on-board for using EHR.

'Though India has progressed well in the adoption of ICT in other sectors, such as banking, railway reservation, etc., and has an established IT industry, it has not yet utilized the potential of ICT in the healthcare sector,' said Srivastava.

'In public healthcare institutions, the usage of ICT is limited to billing and registration. The private sector has a limited form of electronic medical records (EMR) but it has not yet started the exchange of health information to improve quality of care,' he said.

The GJC Council has over six lakh participants which includes those from wholesalers, retail-

ers, distributors, manufacturers, gemologists and designers.

The seminar on the initiative termed 'Labham' is an educational workshop that teaches the best practices to be followed in the gems and jewellery sector. It also covers topics from income tax, GST, to hallmarking. Labham will help those who wish to understand more about the gems and jewellery sector and also to those who wish to enhance their expertise by learning the best practices of the industry, said officials. Speaking at a press conference here in Chennai, re-



gional chairman of GJC, N Anantha Padmanaban, spoke of the positive response throughout the gems and jewellery sector for the initiative. 'It will enable all participants to operate their business in a more professional manner,' he added.

He also spoke about the challenges the gems and jewellery sector faces. 'After the Nirav Modi scandal, it has become difficult for traders to receive fundings from the banks.'

Padmanaban said this affected jewellers in expanding their business for the past six months.

**CCI dismisses complaint against 37 railway signalling cable suppliers**

New Delhi, July 18 (PTT):

Competition Commission has rejected allegations of unfair business practices made against 37 railway signalling cable suppliers even as it suggested that procurement policy of the Indian Railways should be reassessed to ensure accountability of entities participating in the tendering process. In a 49-page order, the watchdog said 'no case of contravention' of competition norms has been found and disposed of the matter.

There was no violation of Section 3 of the Competition Act that pertains to anti-competitive agreements. The ruling came on a complaint filed by a North Western Railway official alleging that the 37 entities had formed a cartel for supply of railway signalling cables and that they quoted high rates.

Investigations by the Director General (DG) -- the probe arm of the regulator -- found that 11 entities had violated competition norms but did not find any contravention by the remaining 26 entities.

'In the present case, neither there is any evidence of anti-competitive agreement or arrangement amongst five sub-sets of bidders nor any circumstantial evidence to establish tacit collusion.'

'Even though the DG found certain instances of identical/ similar pricing, the investigation does not bring out that the same was an outcome of collusion,' the Competition Commission of India (CCI) said in its order dated 12 July.

According to the regulator, owing to structural links and family relationships, among other factors, the five subsets of bidders had the opportunity to exchange information and coordinate their behaviour. However, the CCI said, 'In absence of sufficient and cogent evidence to show collusion,' it cannot be conclusively established that they have acted in contravention of the provisions of Section 3.
